Phase 2 (May – June):

- Adult Collections, Music, Movies, and Teen Graphic Novels are located on the second floor.
- Youth and Teen Collections are shifted to a temporary location on the first floor. Some items are in storage, but staff can place holds for titles from other libraries.
- Service Desks on both floors have been temporarily relocated.
- Youth Area and Story Rooms are blocked off for construction.
- New North Entrance will be created for easier access from the west and east parking lots.

Once the renovation is completed in early 2022, we look forward to offering you a new and improved library!

- More study rooms and collaborative spaces
- New north entrance for easier access from the parking lots
- A new makerspace and expanded digital media
- A more convenient café with healthy vending options
- Space to easily browse new and popular materials
- A larger, quiet reading room overlooking the pond
- A nursing mother's room
- Expanded teen space
- Dedicated elementary space

After the completion of the Main Library renovation, we'll also be renovating our North Hoffman and Rand Road Branches.

Renovation Phase 2 and 3

We are well into our Main Library Renovation Project and getting more excited to provide new spaces in the Library. The project, which started in December, is ahead of schedule and should finish in the Fall. We have made sure that visitors have access to most if not all collections. Signage in the Library directs you to the temporary location of materials, and staff are always able to help.

Phase 3 (Starts in July):

- Youth and Teen Collections will be back in their newly-renovated home!
- The Workshop Desk and spaces will be introduced on the first floor with new technology, digital media studios, and a maker lab.
- New Materials, Movies, and Music will also return to the first floor.
- Adult Collections on the second floor will be temporarily closed to the public. Staff will be able to retrieve materials upon request.
