Teacher Guide: a "Just Because" Poem

Introduce poetry as a literary form.

What is poetry? Poetry is a type of writing. It stirs our imagination and senses by carefully choosing and organizing words to create meaning and rhythm.

Read and discuss the sample poem together.

"Just Because" poems use structure and repetition to challenge stereotypes.

Just Because

Just because I'm small doesn't mean I can't dream big, doesn't mean I'm not still growing, doesn't mean I'm worthless.

Just because I can't reach the top shelf doesn't mean I can't reach for stars, doesn't mean you should look down on me, doesn't mean I don't walk tall.



Just because I'm small, let me be me.

What are stereotypes?

What is this poem about? How does it make you feel?

How does this poem challenge your assumptions about someone?

Brainstorm together.

Make a list of stereotypes as a class.

Write.

Write a sample poem together. Choose one stereotype and brainstorm words and ideas that go with it, then use the template to create a poem.

Challenge students to continue brainstorming and create their own poems, choosing a topic that is personally meaningful.

Share.

Read your poems out-loud.

- Listen for repetition and structure. Practice identifying the **stanzas**.
 - Stanzas are lines grouped together in a structure that repeats throughout the poem.
- How do the poems make you feel? How do they create empathy? Why is empathy important?
