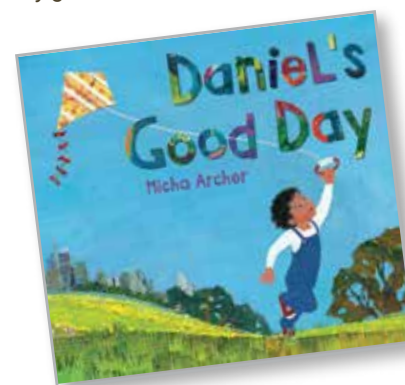


Celebrate StoryWalk®'s Fifth Year!

Long workdays, kids' schedules, and busy lives sometimes make it hard to find the time to visit the Library. We've got a solution – introducing Extended Access!

Extended Access is a self-service that allows members to visit both Branches before and after hours without staff present. During these hours you can browse the collection, use the self-checkout stations, use the computers, print, scan, and fax documents, pick up your holds, or just enjoy a quiet place to read and study.
