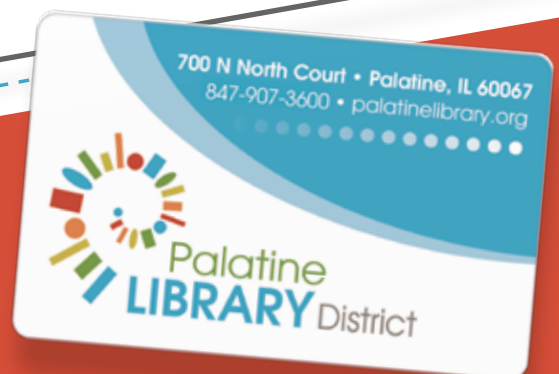

Learn, Share, Connect

Building a Community for Non-English Speakers

How two Library programs are helping our members improve their English speaking and reading skills while connecting with their community.



It's hard to be new in your neighborhood, but even harder when you are learning a new language in a new country. That's what Library member, Fukiko Kiyomi, faced when she moved to the U.S. from Japan just eight months ago.

Every week since January, Fukiko, also known as Fuki, attends the Library's ESL programs, Conversation Club and Read Together to practice speaking English and strengthen her reading skills. Through this, she has noticed that her confidence in speaking English has grown because she gets to interact with other language learners like herself.

“When I come (to the Library), I have so many chances to talk to people...”

“In spite of living in the U.S., I have no chance to talk with other people in my neighborhood, it's very difficult. When I come [to the Library], I have so many chances to talk to people using the materials so it's really good for me,” Fuki said.

She says that the Library's programs are vital to her journey in learning English and credits Library staff Anna and Christi, and ESL Conversation Club volunteer, Cindy, who have created a welcoming environment for all who attend.

“Anna, Christi, and Cindy are attentive and kind. They welcome all questions from the group, always talk to us, and ask how we are doing,” Fuki said.

Fuki first learned about the ESL programs through our print newsletter when she moved to Hoffman Estates, but she was too nervous to attend. She wasn't sure if she had the basic English skills that are recommended to go to the programs and notes that English is not easy to learn.

But she was still determined to give it a try, and she's glad she did. Every week, she gets to improve her English, read new books like *Wonder*, her favorite from ESL Read Together, and spend time with Anna, Christi, Cindy, and her new community.
